Sec. 418.002. Purposes.

The purposes of this chapter are to:

(1) <u>reduce vulnerability of people and communities</u> of this state <u>to</u> <u>damage</u>, injury, and loss of life and property <u>resulting from</u> natural or manmade <u>catastrophes</u>, <u>riots</u>, or <u>hostile military or paramilitary action</u>;

(2) <u>prepare for</u> prompt and efficient <u>rescue</u>, <u>care</u>, <u>and treatment of</u> <u>persons</u> victimized or <u>threatened by disaster</u>;

(3) <u>provide a setting conducive to</u> the <u>rapid and orderly restoration and</u> <u>rehabilitation of persons</u> and property <u>affected by disasters;</u>

(4) <u>clarify and strengthen the roles of</u> the governor, state agencies, the judicial branch of state government, and <u>local governments</u> in prevention of, preparation for, response to, and recovery from disasters;

(5) <u>authorize and provide for cooperation</u> in disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery;

(6) <u>authorize and provide for coordination of</u> activities relating to <u>disaster</u> mitigation, <u>preparedness</u>, response, and recovery by agencies and officers of this state, and similar <u>state-local</u>, interstate, federal-state, and foreign activities in which the state <u>and</u> its <u>political subdivisions</u> may participate;

(7) <u>provide an emergency management system</u> embodying all aspects of predisaster preparedness and postdisaster response;

(8) <u>assist in mitigation of disasters</u> <u>caused</u> <u>or aggravated by</u> <u>inadequate</u> <u>planning</u> for and regulation of public and private facilities and land use; and

(9) <u>encourage</u> state agencies, <u>local governments</u>, <u>nongovernmental</u> <u>organizations</u>, <u>private entities</u>, <u>and individuals to adopt the goals of the</u> <u>strategic plan of the Federal Emergency Management Agency</u> for preparing for, responding to, and recovering from a disaster that <u>emphasize cooperation</u> among federal agencies, state agencies, <u>local governments</u>, <u>nongovernmental</u> <u>organizations</u>, <u>private entities</u>, <u>and individuals</u> <u>in each activity or project</u> <u>undertaken</u> <u>to ensure that this state is prepared to effectively respond to</u> and recover from <u>a disaster</u>; and

(10) <u>provide the authority and mechanism to respond to an energy</u> <u>emergency</u>.

Sec. 418.003. Limitations.

This chapter does not:

(1) <u>limit the governor's authority to</u> apply for, administer, or <u>expend any</u> grant, gift, or <u>payment</u> in aid of disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, or recovery;

(2) <u>interfere with</u> the course or conduct of <u>a labor dispute</u>, <u>except</u> that actions otherwise authorized by <u>this chapter or other laws may be taken when</u> <u>necessary to forestall or mitigate</u> <u>imminent or existing danger to public health</u> <u>or safety</u>;

(3) <u>interfere with dissemination of news or comment on public affairs</u>, <u>but any communications</u> facility or <u>organization</u>, including radio and television stations, wire services, and newspapers, <u>may be required to</u> <u>transmit or print public service messages</u> furnishing information or instructions in connection with a disaster or potential disaster;

(4) affect the jurisdiction or responsibilities of police forces, fire-fighting forces, units of the armed forces of the United States, or of any of their personnel when on active duty, but <u>state</u>, <u>local</u>, <u>and interjurisdictional</u> <u>emergency management plans</u> <u>shall place reliance on the forces available for performance of functions related to disasters</u>;

(5) except as provided by Section 418.184, <u>authorize the seizure or</u> <u>confiscation of any firearm or ammunition from an individual who is lawfully</u> <u>carrying or possessing the firearm</u> or ammunition; or

(6) <u>limit, modify, or abridge the authority of the governor to proclaim</u> <u>martial law</u> or exercise any other powers vested in the governor under the constitution or laws of this state independent of or in conjunction with any provisions of this chapter.
