Section 418.107: Local Finance.

(a) <u>A political subdivision may make appropriations for emergency</u> <u>management services</u> <u>as provided</u> by law for making appropriations <u>for</u> <u>ordinary expenses</u>.

(b) <u>Political subdivisions may make agreements for the purpose of</u> <u>organizing emergency management service divisions</u> <u>and provide for a</u> <u>mutual method of financing the organization of units</u> <u>on a basis</u> <u>satisfactory to the subdivisions</u>.

(c) <u>A local government entity may render mutual aid to other local</u> <u>government entities under mutual aid agreements</u> or the system.

(d) <u>A political subdivision may issue time warrants for the payment</u> of the cost of any equipment, construction, acquisition, or any improvements for carrying out <u>this chapter</u>. The warrants shall be issued in accordance with Chapter 252, <u>Local Government Code</u>, in the case of a municipality, or Subchapter C, Chapter 262, Local Government Code, in the case of a county. <u>Time warrants issued for financing permanent</u> construction or improvement for <u>emergency management purposes are</u> <u>subject to the right of the voters</u> to require a referendum vote under Section 252.045 or 262.029, Local Government Code, as applicable.
