Prosecutor Shapiro opened this discussion, by declaring that Mr Coffelt was "With-in the Bounds of Our Legal System". Prosecutor Shapiro continued on to declare, that, Mr Coffelt had "Admitted his Guilt" of the Crimes he was accused of, and that he had "Turned a Corner", and that Mr Coffelt "Understood what he did was Wrong".

Prosecutor Shapiro then continued on to declare, that, because of how he viewed that Mr Coffelt was making such significant improvements in his Social Responsibility, that, Prosecutor Shapiro was "Not Asking for Punitive Sanctions", but just for "Probation".

Prosecutor Shapiro followed by declaring that "Coffelt is exactly what we are looking for"; in terms of people convicted of crimes and who submit to the programs which those Prosecutors suggest for them.

Mr Coffelt was represented by a bar-member attorney named similarly as "Garerra" or "Govera".

That Attorney declared that Mr Coffelt had gone through a "Transformation", and that the group of Colorado Constitutionalists with whom Mr Coffelt had been involved with were a "Cult"; and that Mr Coffelt's previous "Good Intentions" were so miss-guided, as to place Mr Coffelt "On the Pathway to Hell"; and that Mr Coffelt now clearly comprehended, that, his previous actions with that group were "Wrong".

Mr Coffelt then spoke to Presiding Judge Spear directly. Mr Coffelt there-in declared that he intended to find future employment in his similar previous employment in the "Gaming Industry".

This author noted that the tone of voice of Mr Coffelt was almost Crying; as he pleaded humbly for presiding Judge Spear to refrain from sentencing Mr Coffelt to serve any actual prison time.

More specifically, Mr Coffelt clearly declared that "It was My Own Personal Vendetta" that he had been pursuing through his activities with the Colorado Constitutionalist's group; and that, there-under, he had actually been engaged in "Terrorizing Public Officials".

Mr Coffelt proudly admitted that he had worked on the "Trump Campaign".

Presiding Judge Spear sentenced Mr Coffelt to "Four Years Probation", and to attend regular "Mental Health Evaluation and Therapy", and "Anger Management" counseling.
