(1) <u>A person commits</u>

obstructing government operations

<u>if</u>

<u>he intentionally obstructs, impairs, or hinders</u> <u>the performance of</u> a <u>governmental function</u> by a public servant, <u>by using or threatening to use violence</u>,

force, or physical interference or obstacle.

(2) <u>It shall be an affirmative defense</u> that:

(a) <u>The obstruction, impairment, or hindrance</u> <u>was of unlawful action by a public servant;</u>

or

(b) The obstruction, impairment, or hindrance was of the making of an arrest; or

(c) The obstruction, impairment, or

hindrance of a governmental function was by

lawful activities in connection with a labor dispute with the government.

(3) Obstructing government operations is a class 3 misdemeanor.
