Every court of justice has power:

(1) <u>To preserve and enforce order in its immediate presence</u>.

(2) <u>To enforce order in the proceedings before it</u>, <u>or before a person or body</u> <u>empowered to conduct a judicial investigation</u> under its authority.

(3) To provide for the orderly conduct of proceedings before it or its officers.

(4) <u>To compel obedience to its judgments, orders and process</u>, <u>and to the orders of a</u> <u>judge out of court</u>, <u>in</u> an action, suit or <u>proceeding pending therein</u>.

(5) <u>To control</u>, <u>in furtherance of justice</u>, the <u>conduct of its ministerial officers</u>, <u>and</u> <u>of all other persons</u> <u>in any manner connected with</u> <u>a judicial proceeding before it</u>, <u>in every matter appertaining thereto</u>.

(6) <u>To compel</u> the attendance of persons to testify <u>in</u> an action, suit or proceeding pending therein, in the cases and manner provided by statute.

(7) <u>To administer oaths</u> in an action, suit or proceeding pending therein, and <u>in all</u> other <u>cases</u> where it may be <u>necessary in</u> the exercise of its powers or the <u>performance of its duties</u>.
