**The sittings of Every Court of Justice are Public,
Except that Upon the Agreement of the Parties
to a Civil action, suit or Proceeding,
filed with the clerk or entered in the appropriate record,
the Court May Direct the trial,
or any other Proceeding therein, to be Private;
upon such order being made, all persons shall be excluded,
except the officers of the court, the parties, their witnesses and counsel.**



Means to carry Jurisdiction into Effect;

adoption of suitable process or mode of proceeding.

**When jurisdiction is, by the Constitution or by statute,
conferred on a Court or Judicial Officer;
all the means to carry it into effect are also given;
& in the exercise of the Jurisdiction, if the course of proceeding is not
specifically pointed out by the procedural statutes,
any suitable process or mode of proceeding may be adopted
which may appear most conformable to the spirit of the procedural statutes.**
