(1) Except as otherwise expressly prohibited by law, <u>Any Peace-Officer is Authorized to Perform</u> <u>Community Care-Taking Functions</u>.

(2) As used in this section,

<u>Community Care-Taking Functions Means</u> <u>Any Lawful Acts</u> that are <u>Inherent in</u> <u>the Duty of the Peace-Officer</u> <u>to Serve and Protect the Public</u>.

<u>Community caretaking functions includes</u>, <u>but is not limited to</u>:
(a) The right to enter or remain upon the premises of another <u>if it reasonably appears to be necessary to</u>:
(A) <u>Prevent serious harm to any person or property;</u>
(B) Render aid to injured or ill persons; or
(C) Locate missing persons.
(b) <u>The right to stop or redirect traffic</u> or aid motorists or other persons when such <u>action reasonably appears to be necessary to</u>:
(A) <u>Prevent serious harm to any person or property;</u>
(B) Render aid to injured or ill persons; or
(C) Locate missing persons.

(3) <u>Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to limit</u> <u>the authority of a peace officer that is inherent in the office</u> <u>or that is granted by any other provision of law</u>.
