Hindering prosecution.

**A person Commits the Crime of
Hindering Prosecution, if,**

**with intent to hinder the apprehension, prosecution, conviction or punishment of
a person who has committed a crime punishable as a felony,**

... the person:

- (a) Harbors or conceals such person; or ...**
- (c) Provides or aids in providing such person with money, transportation, weapon, disguise or other means of avoiding discovery or apprehension; or**
- (d) Prevents or obstructs,
by means of force, intimidation or deception,
anyone from performing an act which might aid in
the discovery or apprehension of such person; or**
- (e) Suppresses by any act of concealment, alteration or destruction physical evidence
which might aid in the discovery or apprehension of such person; or**
- (f) Aids such person in securing or protecting the proceeds of the crime.**

(2) Hindering prosecution is a Class C felony.
