A person Commits the Crime of Hindering Prosecution, if,

with intent to hinder the apprehension, prosecution, conviction or punishment of a person who has committed a crime punishable as a felony,

... the person:

- (a) Harbors or conceals such person; or ...
- (c) <u>Provides or aids</u> in providing <u>such person with</u> money, transportation, weapon, disguise or other <u>means of avoiding discovery or apprehension</u>; or
 - (d) Prevents or obstructs,

by means of force, intimidation or deception, anyone from performing an act which might aid in the discovery or apprehension of such person; or

- (e) <u>Suppresses</u> by any act of concealment, alteration or destruction physical <u>evidence</u> which might aid in the discovery or apprehension of such person; or
 - (f) Aids such person in securing or protecting the proceeds of the crime.
 - (2) Hindering prosecution is a <u>Class C felony</u>.
