The <u>Legislative Assembly</u>, <u>shall not pass special or local laws</u>, in any of the following enumerated cases, <u>that is to say</u>:

Regulating the jurisdiction, and duties of <u>justices of the peace</u>, and of <u>constables</u>;

For the punishment of Crimes, and Misdemeanors; Regulating the practice in <u>Courts of Justice</u>;

Providing for changing the venue in civil, and Criminal cases;

Granting divorces; Changing the names of persons;

For laying, opening, and working on <u>highways</u>, and for the election, or appointment of <u>supervisors</u>;

Vacating <u>roads</u>, <u>Town</u> plats, Streets, Alleys, and Public squares; Summoning and empanneling (sic) grand, and petit<u>jurors</u>;

For the assessment and collection of <u>Taxes</u>, for <u>State</u>, <u>County</u>, <u>Township</u>, <u>or road purposes</u>;

Providing for supporting <u>Common schools</u>, and for the preservation of school funds;

In relation to interest on money;

Providing for opening, and <u>conducting the elections</u> of <u>State</u>, <u>County, and Township officers</u>, and <u>designating the places of voting</u>;

Providing for the sale of real estate, belonging to minors, or other persons laboring under legal disabilities, by executors, administrators, guardians, or trustees.
